
Focus on: Families – Prevention, Diversion, and Re-housing in FY 2010

The family hotel crisis peaked in the winter of 2009-2010. Since January, the number of families in hotels in Western Mass has decreased by 48%. In Massachusetts as a whole, that number



has fallen by 35.8%, from 982 families in January to 630 in July.

Prevention, Diversion and Rehousing efforts across the state have contributed to this decline.

In Western Massachusetts, from July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010:

 563 Families were placed into permanent housing from shelters and hotels.

- 1701 families at risk of homelessness were kept in their homes through prevention efforts that included counseling, mediation, negotiation and short-term flexible funds; 24% of these prevention outcomes were funded with ICHH dollars.
- 137 families were diverted from shelter; 42% with ICHH funds. Diversion is when a family is determined to be EA eligible by DHS staff at the local offices, but instead of entering the shelter system the family is assisted with an alternative housing arrangement.
