# MA sex offender residency restrictions

Updated 3.2.11

Based on a Jan. 2009 survey of MASOC and MATSA members, and additional agency inquiries, it appears that at least the following cities and towns in MA have passed or considered some form of residency restriction for sex offenders. Note that this information has <u>not</u> been officially confirmed by the municipalities or legal authorities. Also, town meeting season is beginning anew in many places, so restrictions may be considered in additional towns this spring. It appears that towns require legal review by the AG's office before implementing residency restrictions they have passed, while cities in MA do not. Thank you to Joan and Laurie for coordinating the collection of this information.
