



Georgiana recently earned her National Career Readiness Certificate through ACT, a credential demonstrating achievement in workplace employability skills. As the mother of a 2 ½ year old daughter, Georgiana is constantly on the go, but loving every minute of it



Taisha Anderson is a single mother who has three children. One child attends high school and the younger children attend Elementary School. Taisha has been with CommCET since January. She had a career as an Administrative Assistant, working in the field for 8 years, she was laid off which landed her homeless living in a hotel. Community Teamwork Inc. collaborated with the Career Center through CommCET and designed programming specific to CommCET clients. Taisha was able to job search, look at the job labor market and redo her resume with individual attention from the Career Center staff. Taisha came to CommCET feeling overwhelmed and discouraged. Through the partnership and staff reinforcement and encouragement she was able to obtain employment on Thursday April 18, 2013 working at Comcast as an Administrative Assistant making \$12.00 an hour. The CommCET client service coordinator partnered with Suitability to obtain professional clothing at no cost to Taisha for the interview. Taisha's home-based is set to end in August of 2013. Taisha had fees from the Registry of Motor Vehicles that were preventing her from obtaining her license. Taisha through the Revolving loan fund received \$716.00 and paid off her fines. She is eligible to receive on July 17th \$600.00 from the employee incentive program for being employed for 90 days. She will use the money toward paying off the loan. Taisha's neighbor gave her a car because they could no longer drive in exchange that Taisha will runs errands for her when it is necessary. Taisha's goal is to obtain employment making more money in her field.
