




Housing Placement

Days Until Housed




Housing Retention

Housed Clients, Living Situation at Discharge




NOTE: 88% of housed MISSION clients retained housing at discharge.

NOTE: Mental health improved for anxiety, depression and concentration/ memory.


Change at Discharge Substance Use Past Month



NOTE: Substance use increased for alcohol and marijuana, but decreased for cocaine and heroin.



Change at Discharge Substance Use Past 6 Months




NOTE: Substance use increased for alcohol use. Usage remained similar for intoxication, drug use, cocaine and marijuana. There was a reduction in heroin usage.

Program Impact

Housing	92% of enrolled clients were housed. Of those clients, 88% retained housing at discharge.
Mental Health	Improvements in anxiety, depression and trouble with memory/concentration. Slight increase in problems for hallucinations, trouble controlling violent behavior.
Substance Use	Reduction in heroin, increase in usage for alcohol, little change for other substances.
Hospitalizations	Reductions in hospitalizations across all categories except small increase in ER visits for substance use.
BASIS	Improvement across all BASIS domains.
