

3 County CoC Point In Time Count | 2017

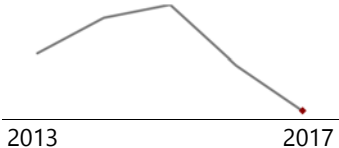
The 2017 Point in Time Count was conducted on January 25th, 2017 with a complementary service-based count running through January 31st, 2017. Data was collected from HMIS, from online survey forms for nonHMIS programs and street outreach, and from provider surveys.

Overall Count

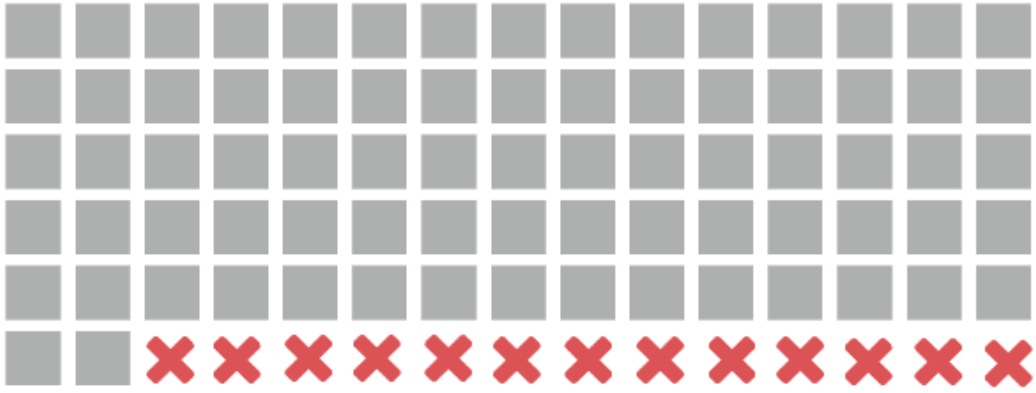
The number of homeless persons identified during the 2017 Point in Time Count decreased by 15% compared to the 2016 Point in Time Count. In total, 96 fewer persons were homeless in 2017 compared to the previous year. The decrease was due to reductions in the hotel/motel census (from 76 persons to 0 persons); and in reductions in GPD beds (from 241 beds to 213 beds). Overall:

- ✘ The number of sheltered persons in families decreased by 31%
- ✘ The number of sheltered individuals decreased by 15%
- ✚ The number of unsheltered persons increased by 96%

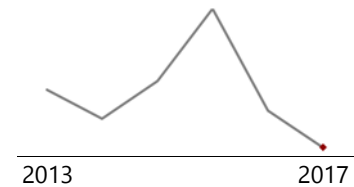

Sheltered Persons in Families

The number of homeless families decreased from 57 households to 39 households between 2016 and 2017, with 61 fewer persons homeless, on account of the hotel/motel census dropping to zero. The last family in a hotel/motel room exited for permanent housing in September 2016.

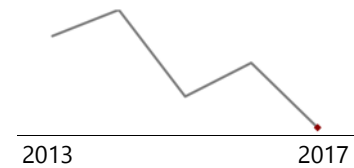

Sheltered Individuals

After a small uptick in 2016, the number of homeless individuals in shelter declined by 15% in 2017. The decline was driven by a reduction in Soldier On TH beds, which dropped from 241 in 2016 to 182 in 2017. In contrast, the number of individuals in emergency shelter climbed from 150 persons in 2016 to 166 in 2017, an increase of 11%.

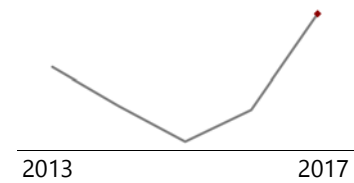

Unsheltered Persons

The number of unsheltered persons nearly doubled between 2016 and 2017, reaching a 5-year high of 55 individuals in 47 adult-only households. More unsheltered individuals were counted in Amherst, Greenfield, and Northampton in 2017 compared to 2016. No unsheltered families with children were identified.

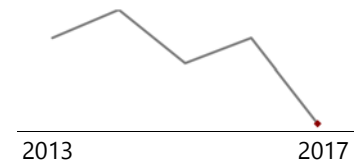

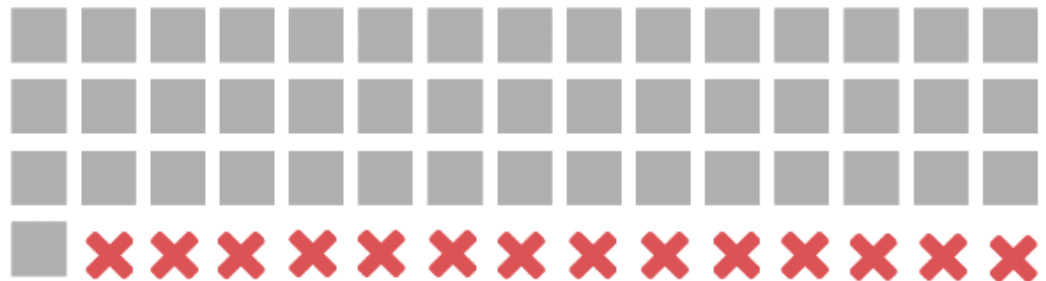
Veterans

Of all veterans in shelter, only 10 individuals were staying somewhere other than Soldier On. These individuals were staying in CoC ES. An additional 17 individuals were staying in ES at Soldier On. Overall 13% of veterans were identified in ES vs. 86% identified in TH. Four veterans were unsheltered. No veterans in families were identified.

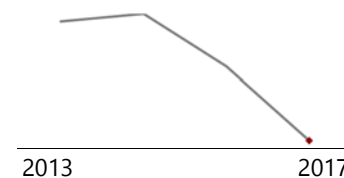

Chronically Homeless Persons

The number of chronically homeless (CH) persons, including persons in CH families, stayed constant from 2016 to 2017 – as did the rate. The precipitous decline in the CH count from 2015 to 2016 was due to a change in the definition of CH status, which excluded many persons previously classified as CH.

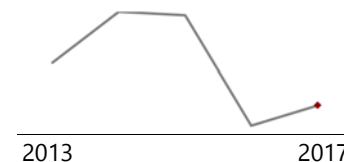

Youth/ Young Adults

Young adults comprised 8% of all adults enumerated during the PIT count. Twelve more young adults were identified in 2017 compared to 2016; it's unclear what drove this uptick. Four young adults were unsheltered, representing 10% of all unsheltered persons. No unaccompanied youth under 18 yrs old were identified.
