







Increases Among Both Families and Individuals 2019-2023






Unsheltered Homeless in Western Massachusetts Trend 2019–2023





Select Characteristics of Homeless Adults Trends 2019 - 2023










Rental Assistance Works

- In the four counties of Western Massachusetts—
- Payment of rental assistance keeps tenants in their housing
 - For the one-year period ending March 2023—
- 8,878 tenancies preserved, at a cost of \$25 million The demand continues to be very high
 - 2,479 applicants in April 2023

Housing Justice Response: 4 Pillars

1. Prevent displacement

- Improve access to rental assistance
- Access to legal counsel in evictions
- Local option for rental control and tenant protections

2. Preserve existing and affordable housing

Tenant Opportunity to Purchase Act

3. Create more affordable housing

Local Option Transfer Fee to Fund Affordable Housing

4. House people who are unhoused

- Reduce barriers to shelter
- Flex Pool for Permanent Supportive Housing
