
A multi-year look*

*This data is based on information reported in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) (e.g., does not include people who are living doubled up). Because racial demographics are not tracked in Office of Refugee and Immigrants' family shelters (90 people), certain groups are underreported in the demographic data for 2023. This results in an underrepresentation of the proportion of people experiencing homelessness who identify as black, hispanic or latino, or with multiple races.

Homeless response system

Inflow: 513 people entered our homeless system for first time

Outflow: 270 people exited our system; **155** of those reported an exit to permanent housing

Preventing and ending homelessness

Since November 2022, Berkshire
Housing has processed nearly **5,000 RAFT applications and provided rental assistance to 885 households. Roughly 100 households seek rental assistance every week** in Berkshire
County alone.

Eviction filings are rising. Following the end of pandemic protections and funding, eviction filings in western MA have grown from 3,638 residential eviction filings in 2021 to 5,832 filings in 2023--a 60% increase. There were 465 filings in Berkshire County alone in 2023.

Only **3% of tenants** have lawyers in eviction cases, while **over 90% of landlords** are represented.

Housing ends homelessness. Berkshire County developers currently have 134 units of affordable rental housing in the pipeline, including 37 units of permanent supportive housing.

Rents have skyrocketed. Berkshire County median rent rose 12% over the 3-year period 2019 to 2022.
