Individual Services Committee Meeting Minutes - 4/22/25

In attendance: approximately 30 providers and community partners

Shelter and Housing Updates

CSO:

- a new Safe Havens program (2 year transitional housing, 7 beds for long-term chronically homeless individuals) is opening in Pittsfield in late June/July. We welcomed Jason Godfrey as the new director. This is a DMH internal referral program. This is now the 3rd Safe Havens program in Western MA Westfield (MHA), Greenfield (CSO) and now Pittsfield.
- Groundbreaking took place last week for CSO's new housing and shelter in Springfield 36 units of PSH, 40 additional shelter beds. Congratulations!
- Work continues in Greenfield on its housing development that will also add 36 units of PSH and 40 shelter beds.
- Shelters in Northampton and Greenfield continue to be full, but there is more movement in and out (warmer weather based)
- Medical Respite Program for people being discharged from the hospital and facing homelessness has increased from 10 to 14 beds. There are 3 beds available right now.

Craig's Doors:

- Winter beds at the Econo-Lodge are no longer available. Case managers supported exists
 so that the exits were smooth either shelter beds were located or survival gear provided,
 and housed one person. The outreach team built important relationships so engagement
 will continue over the summer.
- Hotel stay program has also ended for the season, along with shelter overflow space.
- Currently flow at congregate and Econo-Lodge site but also seeing more movement
- Now staffed with a full case management team; working on a pilot program for workforce development, including transit service to employers; currently working on supporting 4-5 people in employment
- Received funding under the opioid settlement grants (via the RISE foundation) to partner with Tapestry in a harm reduction grant; will be enhancing their outreach and case management support read more about it here. A next round of funding is available go here for more information

CHD:

- Under new rapid housing program (funded by City of Springfield), they have housed 13 people who were previously living on the streets
- Winding down temporary low threshold housing program (due to end of funding) 11 people remaining and engaged in rehousing efforts
- Motel 6 shelter is full
- Triage/outreach team still has some hotel funds available; staff is currently embedded in Greenfield and Pittsfield and looking to create more drop-in capacity in Hampden County

Louison House (northern Berkshire County):

- Some winter shelter funding still remains which is very useful because they are seeing a big increase in need
- opening a youth PSH program with 6 beds some contractor delays but hopes to open by next month

Franklin County Opioid Task Force (HUB Project)

- Seeing more people on the river front, seeing more debris working together in the HUB Project to brainstorm responses
- still available funds to do emergency hotel stays
- working with Greenfield Police to coordinate outreach re: available resources

CoC Updates

Springfield/Hampden CoC

- Shout out to CHD's rapid rehousing program long-term unhoused people are getting housed!
- Holyoke Housing Authority has allocated an additional 10 Section 8 vouchers (Moving to Work vouchers) to house individuals who are unsheltered or residing at Motel 6 exciting progress
- Springfield's multi-disciplinary outreach team is working well identifying high need people and also discovering the limits of PSH for severely mentally ill individuals, a level of psychosis that creates a barrier to staying inside
- 20 new units of PSH are opening in August, a collaboration between Home City Development and MHA (which will have onsite staffing) this could offer a hopeful intervention for the severely mentally ill homeless population
- HUD Technical Assistance is support the CoC's work to redesign its coordinated entry system. An upcoming all-CoC meeting on May 9 will offer more of an update on this project. End of June there will be a 3 day workshop to advance this effort further. The goal is to create a high quality response system.

Three County CoC

- Hiring for a full-time DV/EMERG Coordinator
- Will be conducting a summer Point in Time Count to get a more complete picture
- Upcoming trainings include: <u>Community Legal Aid Info Session</u>; <u>Commercial Exploitation of Children (CSEC) Training</u>;
