## Family shelter updates/exchange

We discussed these issues:

- concerns about immigration status families are worried about ICE scared to go out, to work, to school very tense time
- ServiceNet noted a low census that in addition to the reduced units (from 61 to 52), EOHLC is also not filling beds. These empty beds exist while more families are reaching out who have been denied EA eligibility but have nowhere to go (they are tracking numbers on this).
- the 6 month shelter stay limit is creating great pressure; FOR Families can get referrals with only a couple months remaining which limits support options
